The Virgin Islands Government reserves the right to attach special conditions to a permit which may include but are not limited to: neutering, importation limited to males only, de-clawing, de-fanging, hurricane proof fencing, and time-specific renewal.

Virgin Islands non-indigenous species permit or a legible copy must accompany the animal at all times.

Permits will NOT be issue for:

PEST PLANTS, PRIMATES, VENOMOUS SNAKES, VENOMOUS INVERTEBRATES, LARGE CARNIVORES, MARINE SPECIES, SPECIES KNOWN TO HAVE BECOME **PESTS**, SPECIES KNOWN TO BE ECOLOGICALLY DAMAGING, POISONOUS SPECIES, SPECIES HARMFUL TO HUMANS, SPECIES WHICH MAY BE A DISEASE VECTOR.

The Virgin Islands will not be held liable for the injury or death of any animal in a recapture attempt.

The owner of any animal is responsible for capture costs, any damages done to person or property and is liable for any injury incurred in the handling of or inflicted by said animal.

Maintenance of a permitted animal must be in compliance with the Federal Animal Welfare Act and Territorial regulations. Failure to comply may result in revocation of permit. Revocation of permit may result in confiscation of animal.

## VIRGIN ISLANDS EXOTIC IMPORTATION

The Virgin Islands Endangered and Indigenous species law prohibits the importation of non-native organisms without a permit. Non-native plants and animals will be called exotics in these regulations.

A native organism is defined as a wild organism which has been present in the Virgin Islands and naturally reproducing in the wild without the aid of man since 1917. Domestic plants and animals are not native organisms, but their importation may be regulated by the Department of Agriculture.

All exotics require a permit for importation. Due to the great potential for environmental damage, most exotics will not be issued an import permit. Some categories which will not be issued import permits include, but are not limited to: pest plants, primates, venomous snakes, venomous invertebrates, large carnivores and other species known to have become pests.

Omamental plants, freshwater fish and certain birds and mammals commonly bred for the pet trade will be issued import permits with minimal formality. Importers may request that species of interest be added to the list of generally allowed importations. It will be the responsibility of the importer to show that habitat requirements of the proposed organisms will not allow them to survive in the wild in the Virgin Islands.

- TRANSFER: Permits are not transferable from one animal to another
- RESIDENCY: Permits are valid while the animal is in residence in the Virgin Islands. Removal from the Virgin Islands invalidates permits. Re-entry requires new permit.
- CHANGE OF ADDRESS: Notification must be made, within 48 hours, of any change of address where permitted animals resides.
- CHANGE OF OWNERSHIP/CUSTODY: Notification must be made, within 48 hours, of any change in ownership or custody, whether by sale, gift or any other means.
- LOST OR STOLEN ANIMAL: Any permitted animal found to be missing, must be reported within 24 hours.
- INSPECTIONS: The Commissioner of Agriculture, the Commissioner of Planning & Natural Resources or their designated agents, reserve the right to inspect any permitted animal()s and the area in which it is maintained. Such inspections may be conducted at any time, without prior notice.
  - REPORTING OFFSPRING: Any offspring of a permitted animal must be reported within 48 hours. Permit for said offspring is required as soon as viability is established or weaning occurs, which ever comes first.
- VIOLATION: Any violation of a lawful rule, regulation, order, request or law may be considered sufficient cause for the refusal
  of a permit, revocation of an existing permit and confiscation of said animal(s). VIOLATORS WILL BE PROSECUTED TO
  THE FULLEST EXTENT OF THE LAW.

#### FEES

COMMERCIAL: \$100.00 Renewable Annually NON-COMMERCIAL: \$25.00 per application. One application per species.
